



## Consulate of Mexico Indianapolis, Indiana

The scope of this project was to renovate a former printing business facility into a welcoming and modern Headquarters for the Consulate of Mexico. The 11,600 square foot building of brick and concrete block facade restoration respects “warehouse district” aesthetic and the guidelines of the historic Fletcher Place neighborhood. A new main entrance plaza and stair creates a comfortable and welcoming environment leading to a large public lobby. Private employee-only areas are secured from the public areas and include offices for various divisions of the Consulate as well as conference room and private offices for the Consul and Second Consul. The interior design retained existing exposed wood beams and ceilings to create an atmosphere of ethnicity and comfort for visitors. The compact design of the facility provides a beautiful, striking, and relatable urban building which will serve the citizens of Mexico for generations to come.
