The Landrum Bolling Center houses social sciences and interdisciplinary studies. The design, which provides spaces for integration of curriculum, embodies Earlham's commitment to innovation in teaching and learning. The facility consists of three stories with a partial lower floor, and includes: lecture hall and classrooms, 20 station computer and psychology labs, seminar rooms, conference rooms, offices and support spaces. The design of the center is open-ended and flexible so that it can adapt to new technologies in the future.

The building is located close to the main entry of the campus and is a central point for extending the relationships between the college and the Richmond community.
