

The Medical Research Library Building (MRLB) project was envisioned as a solution to the quality study space for medical students and incorporates individual student study stations that allow for greater privacy while also being able to accommodate small group learning environments for break-out sessions. The renovation provided eight (8) small group study rooms, four (4) large group rooms with a capacity of 40 persons each for testing and instruction and a 4,200 square-foot team based learning lab. The renovation also included offices for library staff and new furniture, fixtures and equipment. Improving air quality and energy efficiency in the library were achieved by modifications to the mechanical systems that serve the library.
